STATUS OF EDUCATION IN WAR TRODDEN COUNTRIES

The Impact – Imagine a situation when classrooms are under constant fear of bombing, a place meant for silence facing air siren interruptions. The Russia-Ukraine war is the latest one to witness the horrific war crime. Over 1,800 schools and universities have been damaged or destroyed since Russia's invasion on Ukraine.

In attacks on education, militaries and armed groups bomb, burn, and loot schools and universities and kill, rape, arbitrarily arrest, and recruit students and educators. They use schools and universities for military purposes such as for bases, barracks, or training grounds.

For those who manage to take refuge, have to face language barriers and discrimination and education is compromised. Those who still try and work out a way to continue the impartment of education via remote learning have to face constant issues of internet shutdown.

Afghanistan's education system has been severely affected for more than three decades owing to the armed conflicts. An estimated 3.7 million children are out-of-school in Afghanistan – 60% of them are girls. Military use of schools, crossfire, the presence of soldiers in and near schools, and attacks on school buildings – patterns which have occurred since 2009 in more than 30 countries – affect both boys and girls. But parents often have less tolerance for sending girls to school under these conditions.

According to the **Annual State of Education Report (ASER)** from the International Rescue Committee, in Syria, 59% of 6th graders, 52% of 7th graders and 35% of 8th graders could not read a simple 7-10 lines story - the equivalent of 2nd grade reading skills. 64% of 6th graders, 63% of 7th graders and 46% of 8th graders could not solve a subtraction problem - the equivalent of 2nd grade math skills.

The Solution – UNICEF's Safe Schools Declaration is an inter-governmental political commitment to protect students, teachers, schools, and universities from the worst effects of armed conflict. As of today, 111 countries have endorsed the Safe Schools Declaration. By endorsing the Declaration, countries commit to restoring access to safe education and to developing education systems that are conflict-sensitive and promote respect between social or ethnic groups.

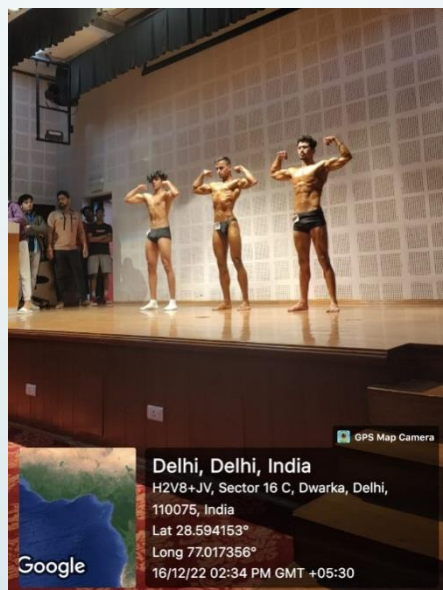

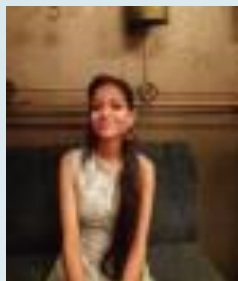

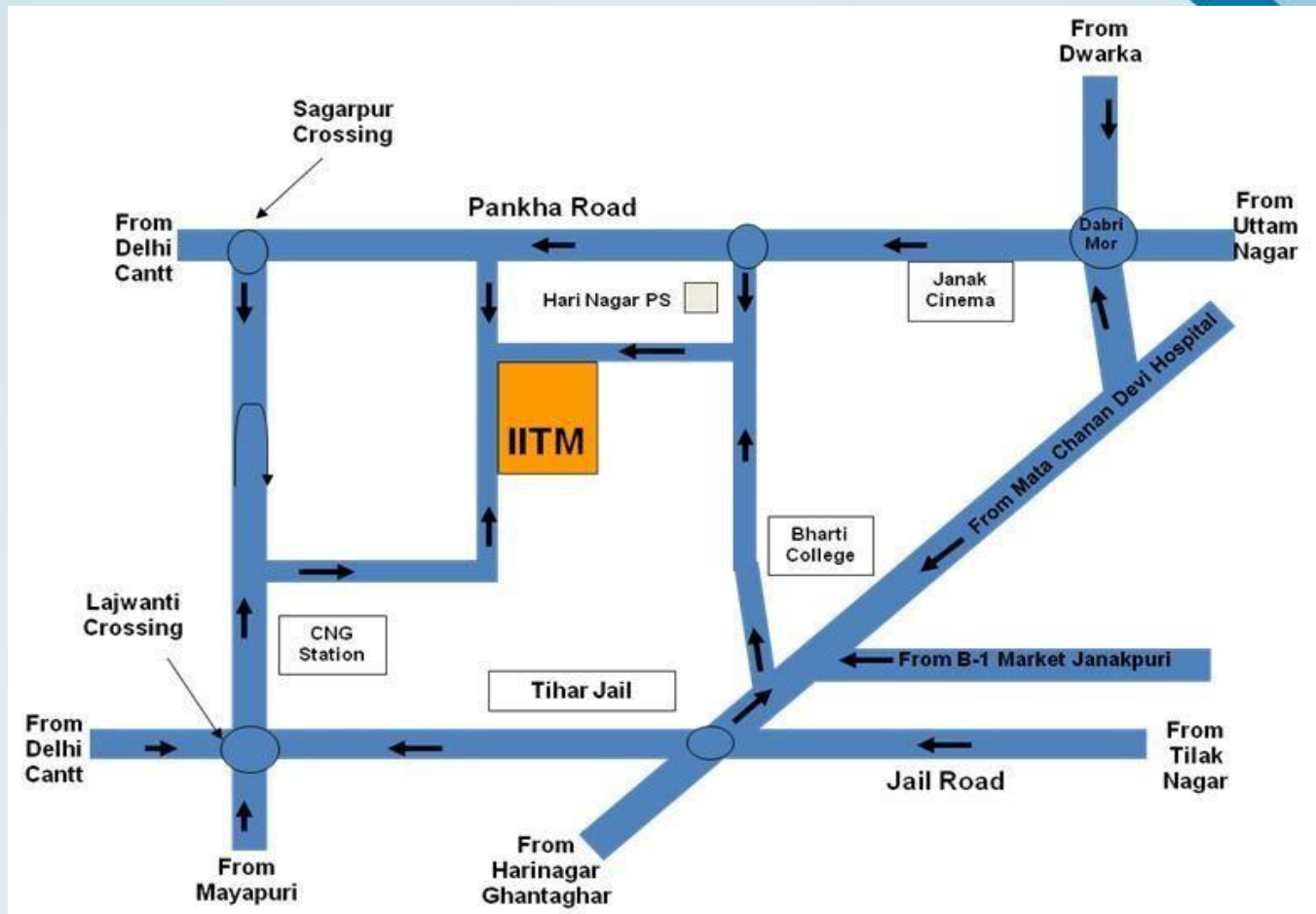
